RESOLUTION 15-112

TREASURER'S REPORT

"Be it resolved by the Board of Education of the Troy City School District, a majority of its full membership therein concurring, that it approves, as submitted by its Treasurer, the minutes of its Regular Meeting of Monday, October 12, 2015."

"Be it resolved by the Board of Education of the Troy City School District, a majority of its full membership therein concurring, that it orders filed for audit the October 2015 SM-2, Monthly Total Revenue, Monthly Total Expenditures, Monthly Ending Balance, Schedule of Revenues Expenditures and Changes in Fund Balances, Five Year Forecast, Appropriation Account Summary and the Investment Schedule."

RESOLUTION 15-114

RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO LEVY A RENEWAL TAX AND REQUESTING THE COUNTY AUDITOR TO CERTIFY MATTERS IN CONNECTION WITH A PROPOSED TAX LEVY

The adoption of the following resolution was moved by Mr. Heffner and seconded by Mrs. Reives:

SECTION 1. That it is hereby declared that the amount of taxes which may be raised in this School District within the ten-mill limitation by levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of this School District.

SECTION 2. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 5705.21 of the Ohio Revised Code, it is necessary that a renewal tax be levied in excess of the ten-mill limitation for the benefit of this School District, for the purpose of current expenses at a rate not exceeding five and eight-tenths (5.80) mills for each one dollar (\$1.00) of valuation for a period of five (5) years. Said tax is proposed to renew an existing five and eight-tenths (5.80) mill, five (5) year levy authorized by a majority of the electors of the school district voting on said proposition at an election held on May 3, 2011.

SECTION 3. That the question of the adoption of said renewal tax levy shall be submitted to the electors of the school district at the election to be held on March 15, 2016. If approved by the electors, said renewal tax levy shall first be placed upon the 2016 tax list and duplicate, for first collection in calendar year 2017.

SECTION 4. That pursuant to Section 5705.03 of the Ohio Revised Code, the county auditor is hereby requested to certify to this board of education the total current tax valuation of this school district and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the number of mills specified in Section 2 hereof, and the treasurer of this board of education be and is hereby directed to certify forthwith a copy of this resolution to the county auditor as required by law so that said county auditor may certify such matters in accordance with Section 5705.03 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this board of education concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this board of education, and that all deliberations of this board of education, and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the rules of this board of education adopted in accordance therewith.

RESOLUTION 15-115

ALTERNATE TAX BUDGET FILING

The adoption of the following resolution was moved by Mr. Kleptz and seconded by Mrs. Reives:

"WHEREAS, Section 5705.281 of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes and empowers a county budget commission, by an affirmative vote of a majority of its members, including an affirmative vote by the auditor of the county, to waive the requirement that a taxing authority of a subdivision or other taxing unit adopt a tax budget, as is provided under Section 5705.28 of the Ohio Revised Code, and require such taxing authority to provide such

information as may be required by the commission to perform its duties under Chapter 5705 of the Ohio Revised Code, including dividing the rates of each of the subdivision's or taxing unit's tax levies as provided under Section 5705.04 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms and provisions of Section 5705.281 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Miami County Budget Commission, by an affirmative vote of a majority of its members, including an affirmative vote by the Auditor of Miami County, Ohio, has authorized and permits the taxing authority of a subdivision or other taxing unit within Miami County, Ohio, to refrain from adopting a tax budget, and has designated the information which the said Budget Commission requires of each taxing authority of a subdivision or other taxing unit to permit the Budget Commission to perform its duties under Chapter 5705 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire and intention of The Troy Board of Education, as the taxing authority of The Troy City School District, to elect to refrain from adopting a tax budget for the fiscal year 2017,

and, in the alternative, to submit to the Budget Commission the information and documents which it has indicated will be necessary in the absence of such adoption; and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT:

RESOLVED, by the Troy City School District Board of Education, Troy, Miami County, Ohio, that:

- The Board of Education of the Troy City School District hereby declares the Intention of the Troy City School
 District to proceed under the alternative tax document format provided under Section 5705.281 of the Ohio
 Revised Code and to refrain from the preparation of a tax budget for the fiscal year 2017; and
- 2. The Board of Education of the Troy City School District hereby authorizes and directs the Chief Fiscal Officer of the Troy City School District to prepare and to submit to Miami County Budget Commission such information and documents as are necessary incident to said process and submission, and to take such other actions as may be reasonably necessary incident thereto; and
- 3. The Board of Education of the Troy City School District hereby finds and determines that all deliberations and actions related to the foregoing were effected in open and public session and in full compliance with Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code, and otherwise as is provided by law."

RESOLUTION TO INVOICE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR PAST CHARTER SCHOOL DEDUCTIONS FROM STATE FUNDING

The adoption of the following resolution was moved by Mrs. Reives and seconded by Mr. Heffner:

WHEREAS, it is the statutory duty of the Troy City School District Board of Education to deliver the educational programs and services to the school children of the Troy City School District, and

WHEREAS, the members of the Board are elected by the Troy City school community to ensure an effective, efficient, vibrant and productive system, and

WHEREAS, the elected board of education is responsible to the community including taxpayers, parents and other patrons, as well as the state, and

WHEREAS, the charter school industry now extracts in the range of one billion dollars (\$1,000,000,000) ANNUALLY from public school districts across the State of Ohio, and

WHEREAS, school district boards of education have no control of students, financing, educational programming and student outcomes who enroll in charter schools, and

WHEREAS, charter schools as a group in Ohio demonstrate low academic performance compared to traditional public schools, and

WHEREAS, the fraud and corruption in charter schools, as reported repeatedly in the public media, has made Ohio the laughing stock throughout the nation, and

WHEREAS, Ohio has been dubbed as the "Wild, Wild West" in charter operations, and

WHEREAS, the Troy City School District has lost a total of \$4,419,123.00 in state AND local funding to charter schools over the period FY 2002 to FY 2015, and

WHEREAS, this deduction has reduced programs and services to Troy City School District students, and

WHEREAS, the Troy City School District Board of Education has a fiduciary responsibility to the students and taxpayers of the District, be it therefore

RESOLVED that the Board of Education direct the Treasurer of the District to invoice the State of Ohio for all the funds extracted from the Troy City School District for charter school students.
