The Board of Education of the Troy City School District met in regular session at its offices at 500 North Market Street, Troy, Ohio, at 5:30 P.M. on Monday, January 9, 2012, for the purpose of organizing itself for calendar year 2012; by electing a president and a vice president for 2012; by fixing, subject to change, the time, date, and place of regular meetings of the Board of Education during 2012; and by appointing its members to various councils, committees, boards, assemblies, and like bodies during 2012. The President Pro-Tempore of the Board of Education, Mrs. Joyce Reives, presided. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the Certificates of Election of Mr. Dave Heffner, Mr. Bill Lutz and Mr. Doug Trostle, were presented to Mr. Jones. These Certificates of Election respectively are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibits A, B, and C. Mr. Jones then orally administered the oath of office to Messrs. Heffner, Lutz and Trostle, who thereafter executed written oaths of office, which respectively are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibits D, E, and F. Mr. Jones then called the roll and the following members of the Board of Education were present: Mr. Dave Heffner, Mr. Stephen Lucas, Mr. Bill Lutz, Mrs. Joyce Reives and Mr. Douglas Trostle. Also in attendance were Mr. Eric Herman, Superintendent, several administrators and spectators.
