After the judging and interview process there will be refreshments and time for each student, if she/he so chooses, to interact with the judges one-on-one.

The Karen Ingle Memorial Art Scholarship of The Troy Foundation was established in honor of the contributions that Karen Ingle made to both her community, as well as the commercial and fine art sectors of society. Miss Ingle's talent and skill are revered today and will be far into the future by those who knew Karen and her work. Evidence of Karen's legacy of art abounds in both the public and private realms. Karen Ingle was a graduate of Covington High School, Covington, Ohio. She polished her creative art talents at the Dayton Art Institute, earning a degree with honors. Upon graduation, Karen became a designer/illustrator at Penny/Ohlmann/Neiman Advertising. After more than 28 years with the Dayton agency, Karen became an entrepreneur starting her own successful business, I-Design. The tragic loss of Karen in November 2001 has left a void in the community and art-world. The Karen Ingle Memorial Art Scholarship Fund has been created to give youth of today the opportunity to aspire to the heights where Karen soared.

Criteria for Applicants – Undergraduate

1. Must be a graduating senior (or graduate) from a high school located in Miami County, Ohio who is enrolling for the first time to pursue an art degree at a college, university or art school.
2. Pursuing an undergraduate degree in Commercial Art, Fine Art, Art History, or Art Education at an accredited 2-or-4-year institution.
3. Grade point average of 2.0 or higher on a 4-point scale.

Application Process

1. Complete required scholarship application available from the high school Guidance Office.
2. Attach a transcript of grades through the seventh semester
3. Submit scholarship application and related criteria to the high school Guidance Office
4. Finalists for the scholarship will be required to give a broader exhibit of their artwork in a private interview with the Selection Committee.

Selection Committee

The Committee will consist of a minimum of three individuals with Chair of the committee being David W. Besecker

Note: Additional Committee Members will consist of individuals with diverse backgrounds from the local art community from year-to-year.

Type and Amount of Scholarship

The amount of the scholarship will be based upon the principle and growth of the fund. If a Scholarship is awarded it is to be no less than \$1,000 annually. The amount awarded may be increased for one individual or divided amongst two based upon the results of the judging process. However, the Selection Committee may elect not to award a scholarship if, in its judgment, a suitable candidate cannot be identified.

Scholarship Intent

The scholarship may be used for tuition, room/board, and purchase of required textbooks or art supplies that are a specific requisite for courses of a student's degree.

Payment of the Awarded Scholarship

The Selection Committee will submit the name of the recommended recipient to The Troy Foundation's Governing Board on an annual basis. The scholarship will be paid directly to the student's attending college after the student has confirmed enrollment by submitting a copy of their tuition bill or current schedule.
